- Too many funerals

- Not enough baptisms and weddings in the church
- No new small groups forming
- Not being able to do as much pastoral care visits as I'd like
- Lack of those under 45 financially supporting the ministries of the church
- Giving to the church is seen as paying the bills, rather than a spiritual discipline
- Fighting over the upcoming renovations without keeping the big picture in mind
- Having our politics influence our faith more than our faith influencing our politics

It's easy for me to get stuck on the twelve things to grieve and forgetting the twelve things to be thankful for.

What does your grateful and grieve list look like as 2018 begins? Which part of the rose bush do you look at?

Let's endeavor to make 2018 a bountiful bouquet of wonderful, colorful, and aromatic roses, even if the thorns prick us every once in a while.

New Committee Structure Approved

At the fall 2017 church conference, the church approved, through voting on the nominations report, to a new format for the administration of the church. Pastor Patrick pushed for this new structure, in part out of necessity as well as for streamlining the business of the church. As anyone who has served in one of the leadership roles of the church can attest, there's a lot of meetings going on. Every meeting is an opportunity lost to "go and make disciples."

The *Book of Discipline* allows local churches to adapt their committee structure to meet the local context. In Kingman the nominations committee agreed that we would be best served through streamlining the committees. Therefore, starting in 2018, the Administrative Council will act as the governing board for every committee mandated by the *Book of Discipline*. The missions and disaster team will remain independent of the Administrative Council, since it is not a required committee. Any social events or education committee will also fall outside of this for the same reason. The Administrative Council will now be the governing board for the church in the areas of administration, finance, trustees, worship, and staffing. Many corporations moved to a model like this in the 1980s and '90s, so the church is catching up. Each one of the areas will still have a small group they can consult, if needed, for the next two years as the transition to this new model comes into being. All votes, however, will be from the Ad Council.

Below is a listing of membership. I want to thank those who have stepped forward to be a part of this new adventure. Expect a few hiccups along the way, as with any new way of doing things. It's great for this to be happening in the church, where we practice forgiveness when those inevitable hiccups occur.

Each church is asked to pay 10% of their giving from two years prior as "doing our share", plus an additional 1% to support the many agencies within the Great Plains Conference.

To give through ACH, a form authorizing the transfer of funds from your savings/ checking account to the church's account must be completed. To begin, or to change the amount being transferred, see Lance Dixon, church treasurer. To contact Lance, email him at lancesdixon@gmail.com or call him at 620-532-4357.

To give through the e-commerce app, go to the church's website. On the home page, about halfway down there is a red rectangle with the word "DONATE" in it. Click on that. You will be sent to the website of the service the church is using to complete the transaction. You can do a "one-time" donation or set-up for a recurring donation.

New Tax Laws

Provide an Opportunity

New Tax Reform Legislation raises the standard deduction for income taxes beginning in 2018. The Congressional Joint Committee on Taxation estimates that the number of taxpayers who will itemize their deductions in 2018 (and thereby get tax savings from charitable gifts) will fall from 40 million under current law to just 9 million under the new legislation.

If you currently itemize, and are financially able to do so, consider giving some or all of next year's gifts to the church before the end of this year. You can claim your gifts on your 2017 taxes (due April of 2018) and give the church a boost. This can be done for regular offering, special gifts such as for a capital campaign or endowment.

To qualify, the gift must be made by the end of this year, given in worship on or before December 31 or postmarked no later than December 30. The check should be dated in 2017 and indicate on the memo line "2018 offering" or other designation.

When in doubt, reach out to the church office to clarify your intentions.

The Trustees Committee recently met with Pat Taylor to discuss church safety. This meeting was prompted by the horrific church shooting in Tennessee. Some of the Trustees members attended a workshop given by the Great Plains Church Conference in Wichita which focused on how to respond in an active-shooter situation. The Trustees will meet again after the first of the year and start working on a plan for safety in all areas for our church. We will keep you updated on any decisions made. The Trustees have approved a Capital Fund Campaign for the purpose of remodeling the sanctuary and upgrading the Air Conditioner system. This formal campaign will take place in April. Many of you have already made contributions for this project. The current Fund balance is \$71,540.00. This is just

under 40% of what will be required to meet the projected cost of the project.


